

# LDS Subjective Epistemology Is Unreliable — Cheat-Sheet

## CORE CRITIC CLAIM

LDS reliance on spiritual feelings (Moroni 10:4, "burning in the bosom") is subjective and unreliable. People in all religions feel confirmations for contradictory truth claims, so the method cannot distinguish truth from error.

## KEY DEFENSIVE POINTS

- **The Bible prescribes the same epistemology.** Jesus: "If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine" (John 7:17). Paul: spiritual things are "spiritually discerned" (1 Corinthians 2:14). Emmaus road: "Did not our heart burn within us" (Luke 24:32). Rejecting experiential epistemology rejects the biblical model.
- **LDS epistemology is not "just feelings."** D&C 9:8: "Study it out in your mind; then ask." D&C 8:2-3: "I will tell you in your mind and in your heart." It integrates rational analysis + spiritual witness + moral fruit + doctrinal consistency + prophetic guidance.
- **All epistemologies are fallible.** Empiricism: optical illusions. Science: replication crisis. Testimony: unreliable witnesses. Demanding an error-proof method sets a standard no epistemology meets.
- **Other religions having spiritual experiences confirms LDS theology.** D&C 93:2: Light of Christ given to every person. Moroni 7:16: Spirit of Christ given to all. LDS doctrine explicitly predicts authentic spiritual experiences across all cultures.
- **Similar is not identical.** The critic assumes all spiritual experiences are the same phenomenon. This is asserted, not demonstrated. Different religions may involve different spiritual realities.
- **The system allows disconfirmation.** D&C 9:9: negative results ("stupor of thought") are possible. Many investigators pray and do not receive confirmation. The system is not rigged.

## KEY SCRIPTURES

Scripture	Point
Moroni 10:3-5	Ask with sincerity, real intent, faith in Christ; Holy Ghost will manifest truth
D&C 9:8-9	"Study it out in your mind; then ask" — rational + spiritual; allows negative result
D&C 8:2-3	"I will tell you in your mind and in your heart" — cognitive + affective
John 7:17	"Do his will → know the doctrine" — experiential test prescribed by Jesus
Romans 8:16	"The Spirit beareth witness with our spirit"
1 Corinthians 2:10-14	Spiritual things "spiritually discerned" — not by natural/empirical means
Luke 24:32	"Did not our heart burn within us" — Emmaus road
1 John 4:1	"Try the spirits" — discernment is required, not blind acceptance
Matthew 7:15-20	"By their fruits ye shall know them" — pragmatic test
Galatians 5:22-23	Fruit of the Spirit as experiential markers
Alma 32:26-43	Faith as ongoing experimentation and observation
D&C 93:2	Light of Christ given to every person
Moroni 7:16	Spirit of Christ given to all — explains universal spiritual experience

## ONE-LINE OBJECTION RESPONSES

Objection	Response
"People in all religions feel the same thing."	LDS doctrine predicts this (D&C 93:2; Moroni 7:16); partial truth produces partial confirmation; similar feelings are not necessarily identical phenomena.
"The burning in the bosom is just emotion."	D&C 8:2-3: "in your mind AND in your heart" — cognitive + affective; and all knowledge involves neural activity — that doesn't make it "just" brain chemistry.
"This is a closed epistemic loop."	Every method involves a prior framework; Moroni 10 and D&C 9:9 allow negative results; the system permits disconfirmation.
"Neuroscience shows it's just brain activity."	Every experience has neural correlates. If God communicates with human brains, brain activity during revelation is exactly what theism predicts.
"Elevation emotion explains it."	Elevation doesn't account for cognitive content (specific thoughts, doctrinal insights) or experiences that are uncomfortable and contrary to expectations.
"Confirmation bias explains positive results."	The conditions (sincerity, real intent, faith in Christ) are demanding, and the system produces negative and ambiguous results for many.
"This is anti-intellectual."	D&C 9:8: "Study it out in your mind." 2 Nephi 9:29: "To be learned is good." LDS epistemology integrates reason and revelation.

## THE FULL LDS EPISTEMOLOGICAL MODEL (5 FACTORS)

Factor	Description	Scripture
1. Rational analysis	Study, ponder, evaluate evidence	D&C 9:8; 2 Nephi 9:29
2. Spiritual witness	Holy Ghost confirms through mind and heart	Moroni 10:5; D&C 8:2-3
3. Moral fruit	Does the belief produce goodness and growth?	Matthew 7:20; Alma 32:33-36
4. Doctrinal consistency	Consistent with scripture and revelation?	Galatians 1:8; 2 Nephi 28:29-31
5. Communal confirmation	Checked against prophets and the church body	D&C 28:2-7

## QUICK COMPARISONS: FALLIBILITY OF ALL EPISTEMOLOGIES

Method	Known Failure Mode
Empiricism	Optical illusions, measurement error, hallucination
Science	Replication crisis, paradigm dependence, theory-laden observation
Testimony	Eyewitness unreliability, false memory, bias
Rationalism	Axioms assumed without proof; Godel's incompleteness
Spiritual witness	False positives, confirmation bias, emotional misidentification

All methods are fallible. Spiritual epistemology's fallibility does not uniquely disqualify it.
